Listen 4 Change: What We've Been Up To in November

- We worked with the Senior Commissioning Manager of the Neurodevelopmental Pathway (NDP) to deliver daytime and evening workshops to inform parent carers about the proposed changes to the NDP and to gather their feedback. Parent carers feedback has been shared with the relevant project leaders across the Cheshire & Merseyside region and will feed into a FAQ document that is being developed.
- We attended a meeting and shared our feedback about the technical design to make Haydock Library a more inclusive and SEND friendly space.
- We met with the Director of Children's Services to discuss feedback from parent carers that has been shared with us at recent events
- We held a coffee morning for parent carers to inform you what we have been involved in during 2025 and for you to tell us your priorities for improving services for children and young people with SEND
- We attended the Autism in Schools Steering Group to meet with the 39 schools that are part of this project to share good practice from Wave 1 schools, discuss funding and training opportunities for schools and to hear updates from TESSA

Listen 4 Change: What We've Been Up To in November

- We attended a Cheshire & Merseyside regional meeting of Parent Carer Forum Leads with the NDP Programme Manager to hear updates on the implementation of the new Profiling Tool, the rollout of training to schools and the development of training for parent carers
- We held a coffee evening with the Council's Head of SEND, Intervention & Inclusion to inform parent carers about the various positive actions that have been taken in response to parents feedback from the 2024 parent carer survey and as part of the first year of the SEND Strategy, to listen to parents lived experiences and to answer parent carers questions.
- We attended our regular Keeping in Touch meeting with senior leaders from education, health and social care and provided feedback/asked for updates on issues parent carers have shared with us around provision available to develop independent living skills, accessing social care support and a lack of specialist short break provision, accessing parent carer needs assessments, ND Profiling Tool and pathway waiting times and other key issues.
- We contributed to the review of the local area SEND Partnership
 Agreement which provides a framework across the St Helens area for all
 key strategic partners, including Listen 4 Change, to collaboratively work
 to achieve the best outcomes for Children and Young People with SEND
- We worked with Children's Social Care to review an easy read document prepared for parent carers to explain how to access social care support for a child with a disability
