BIT	Behaviour Improvement Team – LA Team who offer consultation, support and training to promote good behaviour within schools, as well as directly working with children and young people with social, emotional and behavioural difficulties through individual, group and whole class interventions
Bridge Centre	Base of the Local Authority's Children's Disability Service Early Years Team (0-5 years) which offers pre-school support, speech and language therapy, portage, transition, training, groups and assessments
C & F Assessment	A Children and Families Assessment is a statutory assessment undertaken by the Local Authority's Social Care team

EHCP	Education, Health and Care Plan
Enhanced Support	Support given in school, using additional funding from the Local Authority, to meet the child/young person's needs
EP/Ed Psych	Educational Psychologist offer assessment, consultation, advice and training on how schools and early years settings might help children and young people to learn effectively, and to make the most out of their education
EYFS	Early Years Foundation Stage for children aged 0-5 years
Graduated Approach	A four-part cycle – assess, plan, do, review – to ensure SEN Support is revisited, refined and revised to best support the pupil in making good progress and securing good outcomes.

SENCO/SENDSCO	Special Educational Needs (and Disability) Co-ordinator in schools and colleges
SEND	Special Educational Needs and/or Disability
SENDIASS (aka IASS)	Special Educational Needs & Disability Information, Advice & Support Service
Sensory Diet	A carefully designed, personalised plan that provides the sensory input a child or young person needs to stay focused and organised throughout the day
SEN Support	Support given, using schools own funding, to meet the child/young person's needs
SLT	Senior Leadership Team
SPD	Sensory Processing Difficulties
SPLD	Specific Learning Difficulty e.g. Dyslexia, Dyspraxia.
TESSA	Triage for all Education Support & Specialist Advice. Schools and colleges can refer into TESSA, with parental consent, to get advice about a child/young person when they feel additional support is needed.
